

Casey Safety Village Tall Ted Craft - assembly instructions

1. Find a grownup to help you cut out the pieces, use the dotted lines as a guide
2. Fold all the pieces where you see a solid line and slot the base together
3. Place the small and large posts on the marked road squares (glue if desired)

Now you should have a craft that looks like the one pictured.



Instructions for crossing the road at a school crossing

1. Stand back from the roadside while waiting to cross the road
2. Wait for the Crossing Supervisor to blow the whistle twice
3. Remember to look both ways before crossing and hold a grown ups hand
4. Walk across the road, staying in between the two white lines
5. Do not run, ride a bike or skateboard or bounce a ball when crossing the road

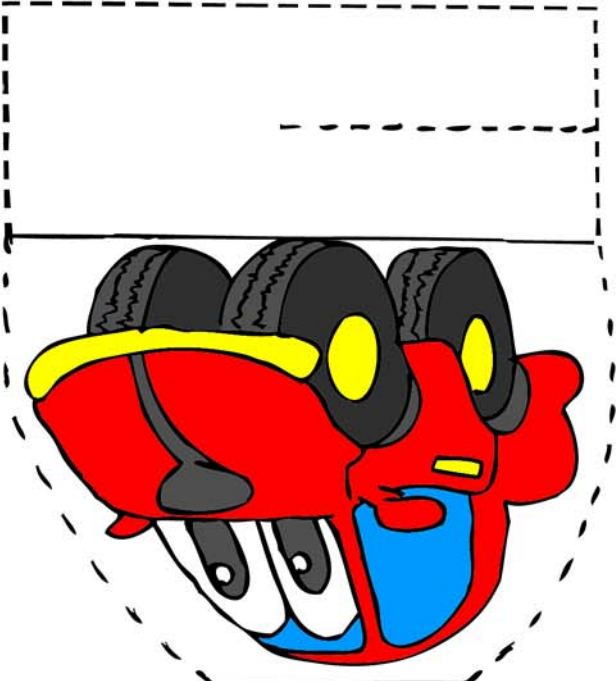
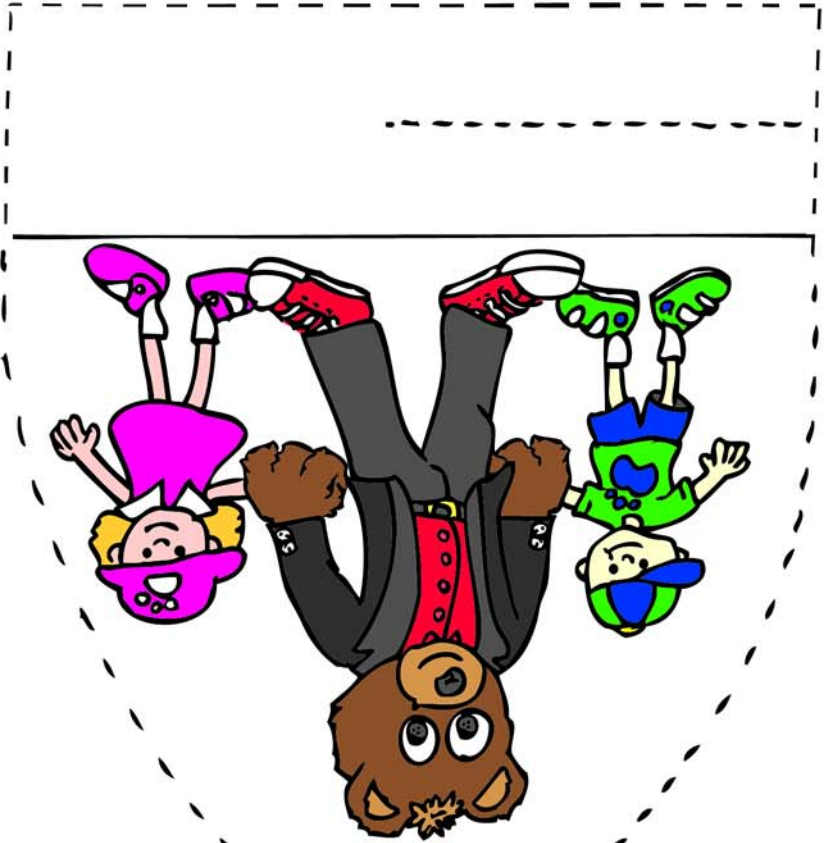
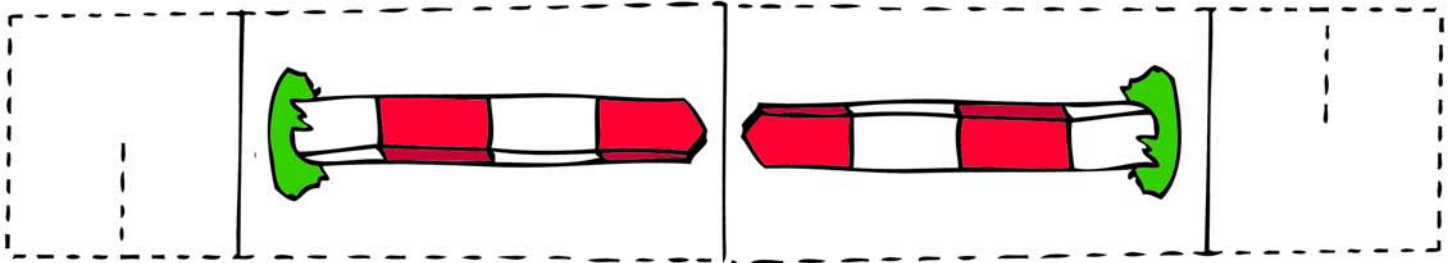
